



Sports Premium grant expenditure: 2020/21

Sport Premium Grant has been used to deliver P.E. across school by specialist coaches. This provision also enables staff to have professional development in a variety of aspects of P.E. We have also used some of our Sport Premium to work with the Sports Partnership across Winsford schools. Our P.E. coordinator regularly liaises with the Sports Partnership within the Winsford Education Partnership (WEP), which has enabled us to provide training for our staff, participate in local school sports competitions and provide us with resources.

- Give a broader experience to a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- Increase the participation of pupils in competitive sports.

Summary of intention of expenditure:

- Purchase equipment to ensure staff have everything they need to teach P.E. to a high standard.
- Provide existing staff with training and resources to help them teach P.E and sport more effectively.
- Run extra-curricular and /or timetabled sports clubs to increase the participation of pupils in active sports.
- Increase pupil's in Key Stage 2, participation in competitive sports by taking part in sports competitions against local schools.
